Title: Urgent action needed to stop a bill which destroys universities

Dear ...

I am writing to you about a horrible disaster for the US universities that just happened in the Senate. On Wednesday Dec 2, Senator Lee brought the devastating bill HR1044 to the Senate floor and passed it by unanimous consent without a single public hearing.

There are now about one million people in the high-skilled green card waiting line, and his growing with employment-based applicants exceeding green card numbers every year. Even worse, H.R.1044 exacerbates the problem through zero-sum legislation. It will repeal the per-country cap of green cards for skilled new Americans as if that alone will solve the backlog. The Congressional Research Service proved earlier this year that the number of people waiting for green cards will double in a decade, while under H.R.1044, the waiting time for immigrants from all over the world will become 17 years, practically destroying the employment-based immigration system in the couptry.

A 17-year wait time will deter the brightest of the foreign students and scholars from coming to the US and much of the research labs in our university will experience a drop in recruitment and applicant quality. This is threatening the very function of the university and will set us back in competition.

To compound the matter, the current language of H.R.1044 also threatens the 360,000 Chinese students in the U.S. with deportation and denial of adjustment of status by a new amendment just added to the language of the bill which could be known as a new "Chinese Exclusion Act".

This is an existential threat to (UNVERSIVY NAME) and a crisis for America's competitive advantage.

وضعیت اقامت در این کشور محروم خواهند شد. وظیفه ما در اولین گام، اطلاع رسانی کامل و درخواست از این قشر برای تحت فشار قرار دادن دانشگاه ها و آگاه نمودن آنها از طریق ایمیل، تماس تلفنی و مراجعه حضوری به دفاتر ذیربط در دانشگاه ها خواهد بود.

Thanks for your response [OR following my previous email]. Just wanted to provide some further info on the bill - mostly according to the Congressional Research Service (CRS) - see attached the full report. Following quotes are from this report. Hopefully this will clarify many misinformation advertised on this bill.

- Did per-country cap create the backlog? No! "The employment-based immigrant backlog exists because the annual number of foreign workers whom U.S. employers hire and then sponsor to enter the employment-based immigration pipeline has regularly exceeded the annual statutory allocation of green cards." CRS report.
- Does this bill eliminate the backlog? No

"S. 386 would not reduce future backlogs compared to current law."

"The total backlog for all three categories would increase from an estimated 915,497 individuals currently to an estimated 2,195,795 individuals by FY2030." CRS report

"Since the number of new beneficiaries exceeds the number of green cards issued each year, the total backlog under both scenarios is projected to more than double..." CRS report

• What is the expected wait time in futures for **all** employment based green card applicants from all around the world?

"By FY2030, EB1, EB2, and EB3 petition holders could expect to wait 7, 37, and 11 vears."

Who will be affected by this:

- 1. **New International faculty members!** This poses risk to US universities to attract international faculty members and researchers as ALL new members will face these long wait times for green cards.
- 2. **Prospective International Students** According to the statistics from the <u>Department of Labor</u> (see PERM data), the majority of the CURRENT recipients of the employment based green cards are US graduates. The flow of NEW

international students to the US will likely drop significantly if they do not have a clear future employment.

Will only certain countries be affected by this bill? No!

" in FY2030, the wait time [for Indian nationals] would be 37 years [in EB2 category], the same as for **all other foreign nationals**."

 Does Long green card waiting time affect US universities ability to attract students? Yes!

"In the face of the substantial wait times for LPR status, however, growing numbers of such workers are reportedly migrating to countries other than the United States for education, employment, or both." CRS report.

While reading the full report, please note that the "Hold Harmless provision" is removed from the latest version which led to the oppositio n of American Immigration Lawyers Association.

"AILA cannot support legislation that places additional burdens on those who are already waiting in the immigrant visa backlog and that would extend the risk of children aging out and keeping families in limbo for longer." <u>AN A</u>

The bottom line is, while (understand the problem and the need for a comprehensive immigration reform, letrongly believe that this bill would do more harm than good, especially to US higher Institutions. Let s be straight here,

Does our university want to be neutral on a bill that limits them from attracting future faculty members from ANYWHERE in the world due to significant waiting times?
Does our university want to be neutral on a bill that jeopardizes its ability to attract graduate students from ALL over the world? (As I mentioned, the majority of those currently receiving EB green cards are US graduates- the pattern is clear.

### IMPORTANT UPDATE ON BILL

I have heard many universities believe there is not enough time to reconcile the differences between the Senate and House version - I am told that the chances are HIGH that a version of this bill will be attached to a **must-pass COVID bill**. Unfortunately this is a surprising tradition in Congress to bypass everything. This bill was passed with **NO Public Hearings**, and now they are going to bypass the reconciliation and next voting.

Again, I reiterate that removing the country cap without adding the number of green cards does not address the fundamental problem, and creates more problems. So respectfully I urge you and our university to act quickly on this matter.

I am reaching out to you to follow up on my previous email regarding the HR1044/S386 bill. I would like to emphasize that the China Exclusion amendment in the current version of the bill passed in the Senate (S386) is not the only issue in this bill.

There are many other issues that would directly affect the educational and economic value of the universities in the US. US universities are reputable all over the world because of the outstanding and brightest faculties that are attracted from anywhere around the world, Asia, Europe, Africa, and many more.

Eliminating the per-county cap on the employment-based green cards would only allow the IT workers, who are mostly from one nation, to enter the US market throughout the course of 17 years! The IT industry will be able to access low-cost labor, whereas, the most educated professionals and academic people from different countries would not be able to become New Americans and serve universities. This will reduce the demand for joining our school, cause some employees to leave for other countries, and overall hurt the US reputation of outstanding universities. According to CRS, by 2030 the waiting time for a green card for anyone including academics will be increased to 38 years. Thank you for your response. I appreciate you taking the time and effort to address my concerns with the devastating, unfair, and short-sighted H.R. 1044 bill.

I request to meet with you and other relevant officials from the university's office of government relations [optional: as well as representatives of All of US - a non-profit organization for high-skilleo immigrants opposing this bill]

Please note that there is a high chance that proponents of this bill will amend it to the upcoming must-pass bills, such as the COVID-19 relief bill or the 2021 appropriations bill. The common assumption that the bill will not pass in the current congress, hence not affecting [name of university] and its interests, can be short-sighted and devastating.

Next, I would like to emphasize that the "China Exclusion" amendment in the current version of the bill, which was passed in the Senate (S386) on Wednesday 12/2, is NOT the only issue in this bill. There are many other issues that would directly affect the educational and economic prospects of the universities in the US. US universities are reputable because of the outstanding faculties and researchers that are attracted from all over the world, Asia, Europe, Africa Australia and so on. Eliminating the per-county cap would only allow the high tech workers, who are mostly from one nation, to enter the US job market for the foreseeable future. These high tech workers barely hold a graduate level degree and would not be a fit for professorship or mentorship or even teaching in the US universities. These High Tech workers who are mainly Non-US graduates would take over the whole number of employment based Green Oards! This will make many qualified prospective faculty candidates from different nationalities reconsider their choice in choosing the US as their next home, due to the uncertainties as objected with the extremely long wait time to obtain permanent residency. Therefore, the demand to join the academic programs in the US will be suppressed. Even the graduates from the US universities would suffer from the falling value of the education in the US and the universities in Canada. Europe and Asia will gain more demand. If HR1044/S386 passes according to CRS, the waiting time for a green card for anyone including academics will be increased to 37 years. Imagine vears of erosion of the most knowledgeable professionals from different countries in the US. I am aware of the fact that you are monitoring this bill but let me tell you that this bill was passed any public hearing last year in house in less than 20 minutes without and it was also passed in the Senate again without any public hearing through unanimous consent in less than a minute.

Unfortunately, this is a very probable scenario for this bill to be <u>attached to the Covid</u> relief bill which means both chambers of the congress don't necessarily need to reconcile the existing differences between the two versions of the bill. In this very probable scenario the bill can be passed through Covid Relief bill without a single public hearing. Therefore, we only have just a few days to show how controversial this bill is to the house reps.
